That should the aforementioned orchestra, the aforementioned leader, or any of the aforementioned musicians; for any reason other than those listed in this Contract, fail to appear and perform, said Employees shall be liable for all reliance expenses,

That all royalties and ASCAP fees connected with this performance, if any, shall be
