We are selecting artists for **one month residencies** from **March thru June**, with <u>two artists per month</u> – ideally, we will feature one artist from Marion County & one from Morrow County per month. Residencies are **non-residential**, but require you to visit Terradise at least three times within your residency month to experience & explore the property. You are allowed to hold down other full-time & part-time jobs during your residency; we do <u>not</u> expect this will be your sole focus or sole source of income during the residency period. That said, we do want you to be available & have capacity for the unique opportunity to focus on creating art inspired by Terradise & the Olentangy that this residency affords. **Which months or months would you be available for a residency?** For ease of scheduling, please select <u>all</u> months that are feasible for you. Terradise Environmental Arts Residency: Residency Vision

<u>What</u> do you hope to make, do, or accomplish during your Environmental Arts Residency with Terradise? [<u>Up to 500 words]</u> Your Residency Vision Statement should do the following:

- Share specific ideas about the potential project or projects you'd like to take on during your TEAR Residency. What <u>new</u>, <u>original artwork</u> will you be able to create, as a result of this residency? How does this new work fit in with your larger goals as an artist or creator/maker?
- Illustrate how the new work you create explicitly engage the property, history, mission, or legacy, of Terradise Nature Center, & our little slice of the Whetstone River. In what way does your work support our mission, of "informing our communities about our natural <u>and</u> cultural heritage"?
- Describe your vision for the culminating 1-hour community event, workshop, or artist's talk you will hold, as a part of the requirements of the residency. Note that the event must either be outside, at Terradise, or hosted remotely via Zoom; we have limited availability for indoor events in the Romine Residence. And don't worry: we will help with tech & marketing!

Terradise Environmental Arts Residency: Residency Purpose

<u>Why</u> do you want to be an Artist in Residence with Terradise? What has called you to this work; & why is this residency experience right for you, at this moment in your artistic practice or career? [<u>Up to 500 Words</u>] Your Residency Purpose Statement should answer the following:

- What is your connection to the environment or the natural world?
- What does the Whetstone (Olentangy) River, or the woods, prairies, & ecosystems of Marion & Morrow County, mean to you?
- What is something you're curious to learn, explore, or experience, about Terradise's site, history, ecology, mission, or legacy, as a part of your residency?
- How will this residency matter for your personal or professional arts practice? Why are
 you seeking this experience now, at this moment in your artistic career? What do you
 hope to get out of it, or to give back?

For all work samples – whether uploaded or linked – please include **a short one-line description of the work**, including subject, materials, date of completion, & any title. For links to social media pages, please <u>screenshot</u> instead of linking, as selection committee members may not have access to social media platforms.

To avoid system compatibility issues that may block selection committee members from accessing your work, <u>do Not Send</u> .docx (Microsoft Word) documents or .HEIC image files. The TEAR Coordinator will conduct a technical review after submission, & will require you to re-submit appropriate listed file formats if you send a file in one of these formats.

We can accept **any combination of five work sample**, & any combination of uploads, links, and/or materials (for paper applicants). Please keep video & music & performance clips **short**: under 2 minutes per clip. You are welcome to either upload materials directly, or provide links to material if it is already online. For links, please specify **which pieces** our selection committee is to look at, & include timestamps for where we should tune in to any time-based media.

WORK SAMPLES

You will be given up to <u>five upload fields</u> to upload work, and <u>up to five link fields</u> to link to individual work that is already online. You can upload/link, across all fields, only <u>five works</u>

<u>TOTAL.</u> Remember to upload or link to <u>individual works</u>, not portfolios or full Instagram feeds.

DESCRIPTIONS OF WORK

For all work samples please include **a short one-line description of the work,** including subject, materials, date of completion, & any title.

Example:

Romine, Ray. 1946. Butterfly Poem. Short poem in "light verse" about the life-cycle of the butterfly. Composed in Marion, Ohio, along a postal route.
